Ringa Toi Exhibition

Ringa Toi is a NZQA student exhibition which celebrates excellence in Māori art for Levels 1, 2 and 3. The selection process involves the students mahi toi being sent in digital form with a description of its meaning and what has inspired them. Ringa Toi 2022 contained more than 80 artworks from students around Aotearoa New Zealand and was on display at the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa in Wellington.

Five of our WGHS students' mahi whakairo (carvings) were selected for the exhibition. Students have worked on Ko (traditional digging sticks) this year to acknowledge the ancestral whenua our kura sits on. The pieces are named 'Ngā Ko o Tiongongo'
