Tēnā koutou katoa

It was so nice to be able to welcome whānau back to assemblies last week to join us in celebrating student successes. It feels like a long time since we have had options other than the virtual assemblies. Thank you for making the time to

come and support your students – it was very much appreciated.

As you know, we have changed our structure this term so that we are operating in three kāhui, each made up of two Houses. This has given us the opportunity for more student leadership roles in the form of the Kāhui Councils which were announced last week. These councils will go from the start of Term 2 each year until the end of Term 1 the following year and will feed into Student Council, providing highly valued student voice as well as organising events for students in their kāhui.

Students from the three kāhui will now be able to apply to be a member of the Student Council and those applications will open shortly. Please encourage your students to take up opportunities to apply for leadership positions. Even going through the application process is good experience as this is what they will need to be able to do in the future.

We have been welcoming new groups of students and staff through a series of mihi whakatau and are very proud of the kōtiro who lead these with the guidance of their kaiako. We warmly welcome Monique Lane who has come from Australia to join the SWITCH team and Jessica Donovan-Maddox who will join our Guidance Team on Friday.

Winter sports are well underway and we all have our fingers crossed tightly that the winter tournaments take place this year, after being cancelled for the last two years due to COVID. Congratulations to everyone who has joined a school sports team and an enormous thank you to all those of you who are coaches and managers as we would not be able to offer the range and number of sports and teams without your help. A big thank you too, to all those who support and encourage your students to play sport.

Next Friday, 20th August, staff will be working on implementation of changes to curriculum, especially with an emphasis on Mātauranga Māori and local curriculum as well as changes to literacy and numeracy. NCEA changes are also coming up with standards being re-written. In addition to the 20th May, we also have days in August and November to keep working on these changes.

Feedback from the recent online meetings with whānau teachers was very positive so we have decided to offer that as an option for the upcoming subject teacher meetings too. You will have the choice of face to face or online or by phone and we hope that you will take up the opportunity for at least one of these to connect with your student's teachers to discuss her progress.

We are excited to be welcoming international students back next term. A big thank you to our international department staff, Amelia Morrison and Toni Richardson, who have maintained contact with agents and worked hard to be ready to welcome international students as soon as we are able. We have very much missed the positive dynamic they bring to our school and look forward to seeing them in the International Department again. We are also delighted to be welcoming Otani High School back for a short visit in July. This is a long standing relationship, interrupted by COVID for the last two years.

The day organised for Year 13 students this week will be very important in supporting them to be prepared for the rest of this year and next and it is important that they do not give in to temptation to use the day to work on their internals. The Year 13 Dean, Phil Mechen, has put in a great deal of time and effort to organise an impressive line up of speakers and workshops which will be of great benefit to the students. We want to see every Year 13 student there.

Although COVID numbers appear to be plateauing across the country, we still have current cases amongst our students and staff and we cannot afford to be complacent. We still encourage the wearing of masks indoors and require it in settings such as assemblies. Masks must be worn on school buses and public transport. We ask all parents and visitors to the school to wear a mask too. Good ventilation is key so please ensure your student has a regulation jersey or jacket, as they will not be sitting in a stuffy room. Windows and doors will be open with heating turned on as the weather becomes colder. Most importantly, please keep your student home if they are unwell. We all need to be considerate of each other and proactive in maintaining good hygiene and safety practices.

We are looking forward to a busy and productive term and to meeting many of you at the various events.
