#### Greetings from the Principal

Tēnā koutou katoa. Talofa lava, Mālō e Lelei, Kia Orana, Fakaalofa lahi atu, Ni Sa Bula Vinaka, Malo ni, Fakatalofa atu and warm Pacific Greetings.

We are farewelling our Gateway Co-ordinator Patsy Yearbury on the 14th of June. We thank Patsy for all the work that she has done to enable our students to experience the world of work. We wish Patsy all the best in her new career pathway.

I have just spent 4 days in Queenstown at the SPANZ (Secondary Principals Association of New Zealand) conference. I would like to share the whakatauki that Sir Ian Taylor shared with us on our last day. Kō ngā tahu ā ō tapuwai inanahi, hei tauira mō āpōpō- "the footsteps laid down by our ancestors create the paving stones upon which we stand today."

My key learning from the conference is that I need to ensure that I spend time on leading initiatives that will produce intergenerational change for our students and their whānau, as well as dealing with the day to day decisions that being a leader of a school involves. Every day I need to frame my thinking around, how does the work that I am doing change peoples' lives? We as a school are on our journey from being a good to a great school so my focus at present is to help to ensure that we are pursuing greatness in all of our classrooms.

At the last two conferences that I have attended I am learning lots about how AI- Artificial Intelligence can be used by teachers to improve the learning of students in the classroom. AI can be used to help teachers to plan lessons and to meet the varying needs of students in their classrooms. We need to embrace the capabilities of AI and take the time to experiment to build our understanding and capability.

We are looking to change how Year 11 runs at our school for 2025. We want to provide opportunities for students to gain NCEA Level 1 over 1-2 years, help to build their understanding around what NCEA is and how it works and to reduce anxiety and build confidence around assessment in the NCEA system. We are proposing that students will sit up to one assessment per course for the 8 semester courses that they study other than English or Mathematics. In English and Mathematics students will be able to gain up to 30 credits. This would enable the students to gain up to 70 credits in Year 11, if they passed the CAAs. 60 credits are needed, alongside NCEA Level 1 Literacy and NCEA Level 1 Numeracy for students to gain the NCEA Level 1 qualification.

It was great to hear from the Principal of St Francis School about the fantastic job that our students were doing as they refereed and ran the













Primary Schools Winter Sports Tournament on the 29th of May. She was impressed by these young people and how they positively engaged with the primary students and ran fair and friendly games. She also commended them for giving back to our primary schools while developing their leadership and sharing their skills. These are the leaders of the future that our community both deserves and needs.

Thanks to our Journalism Club who released their first school newspaper this week. This is a great initiative to help to improve the communication with the students. This is a student-led and run initiative.

#### **Enrolment Zone:**

The Ministry of Education is implementing an enrolment zone for our school for students starting in 2025. As a school we envisage that not much will change for us. All current students attending our school in 2024 are not affected by this new zone. If you have a student attending Whangarei Girls' High School already (Student A) and they will still be on our roll at the 1st January 2025 and your student has siblings who will be enrolling while the original student (Student A) is still attending, the younger students are treated as in zone enrolments. Once Student A leaves the school any other siblings will be counted as out of zone enrolments. N.B. Year 13 students come off the roll at the end of 2024 so will not be attending students at the 1 January 2025. Please see below for the official definition of a sibling:

#### Definition of a sibling

In this context, child A is the sibling of child B If any of the following apply:

a) both children have the same parent; or

**b)** a parent of child A is married to, or in a civil union with, a par ent of child B; or

**c)** a parent of child A was married to, or in a civil union with, a parent of child B at the time when child B's parent died; or

**d)** a parent of child A is the de facto partner of a parent of child B; or

**e)** both children live in the same household and, in recognition of family obligations, are treated by the adults of that household as if they were siblings; or

**f)** the Secretary, by written notice to the school, advises that child A is to be treated as the sibling of child B.

In preparation for 2025, we will continue to do visits to all our contributing schools to share information about our school with all Year 8 students. If you have any questions please feel free to contact me on sonya.lockyer@wghs.school.nz



The Term 3 CAA (Literacy and Numeracy Common Assessment Activities) will be sat between the 9-17 September.

Our School Ball is now on the 3rd of August and will be a combined WGHS/WBHS ball. Thanks to the group of students from both schools who are working hard on the planning for this event. The theme is "A Night under the Stars". Tickets will be on sale within the next week, and behaviour contracts will need to be signed. Tickets are \$75 a person. Years 11, 12 and 13 WGHS students can purchase tickets, and bring plus ones. Years 12 and 13 WBHS students can purchase tickets, but cannot have plus ones. These are the mutual agreements made by the committee's of WGHS and WBHS.

House Day was postponed until Monday the 10th of June due to heavy rain overnight and early in the morning. Students come to school in mufti in their house colours. They attend their normal classes for periods 1 and 2. Interval is from 10.50am - 11.05am. Students then go to whānau class to leave their bags and assemble on the field for the House Chant competitions. Students will be in a team that includes their whānau class and their buddy whānau class. They will take part in four rotations before lunch.

Lunch is from 12.54pm to 1.30pm. After lunch there are four more rotations. Winners are announced at 2.50pm. Please encourage your students to attend and take part in this fun day. The Kaiārahi and Pouārahi have invested lots of time and energy into planning a great day. They have also organised House Day activities in the H6/H7 rooms for students who would find the noise and size of House Day overwhelming.
